AN ACT to amend the Village Councils Act, Chapter 88 of the Substantive Laws of Belize, Revised Edition 2020; to provide for a procedure for the resignation of an elected member of a council; to allow for the Deputy Chairperson to assume the powers and duties of the Chairperson during his absence from office; and to provide for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

BE IT ENACTED, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Representatives and Senate of Belize and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the

Short title.

VILLAGE COUNCILS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2022,

CAP. 88. and shall be read and construed as one with the Village Councils Act, which is hereinafter referred to as the principal Act.

Amendment of section 2. **2.** Section 2 of the principal Act is amended by inserting the following definitions in the appropriate alphabetical sequence—

CAP. 9. ““Chief Elections Officer” means the person appointed under section 10 of the Representation of the People Act;

“Chief Executive Officer” means the Chief Executive Officer in the Ministry responsible for village councils; and

CAP. 4. “Elections and Boundaries Commission” means the Elections and Boundaries Commission established in accordance with section 88 of the Belize Constitution;”.

Amendment of section 9. **3.** Section 9 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) in sub-section (1)(b), by deleting the word “council” and substituting the words “Chief Executive Officer”;

(b) by inserting the following sub-sections immediately after sub-section (1)—

“(1A) A member who intends to resign shall give not less than seven days’ notice to the Chief Executive Officer.

(1B) On receipt of a letter of resignation, the Chief Executive Officer shall, within seven days, inform the Elections and Boundaries Commission of the resignation.”; and

(c) in sub-section (2), by deleting the words “by the council” and substituting the words “by the

Chief Elections Officer, with the approval of the Elections and Boundaries Commission,”.

4. The principal Act is amended by inserting immediately after section 13, the following new section-

Insertion of new section 13A.

“Powers and duties of Deputy Chairperson in absence of Chairperson.

13A. The Deputy Chairperson shall exercise the powers and duties of the Chairperson if the Chairperson is unable to perform his powers and duties as a result of-

- (a) approved duty leave;
- (b) approved vacation leave;
- (c) approved sick leave;
- (d) resignation; or
- (e) any absences from village council meetings.”.
